Accidents:

V01-V99: Transport accidents

W00-X59: Other external causes of accidental injury (*excluding X40-X44*)

Y85: Sequelae of transport accidents

Y86: Sequelae of other accidents

Malignant neoplasms:

C00-C97: Malignant neoplasms

Diseases of the Heart:

I00-I02: Acute rheumatic fever

I05-I09: Chronic rheumatic heart diseases

I11: Hypertensive heart disease

I13: Hypertensive heart and renal disease

I20-I25: Ischemic heart diseases

I26-I28: Pulmonary heart disease and diseases of pulmonary circulation

I30-I51: Other forms of heart disease

Intentional self-harm:
